Early in 2004, up to \$60,000 (3,025,800 Afghani) was granted by the American New York City Bank for repairing of the Press Club for the Ministry of Culture and Youth through the government imports' account pertaining (B.23)/2004,6,...) code (401). Likewise, an amount of up to 30,847 euro (1,813,270 Afghani) had been granted by Kemerz Bank to the ministry's Press Club from which through the government imports' account (B.23)/1425-2004/6/... a sum of up to 2,092,050 Afghani) had been paid through Mawlana Rumi Construction Company, with the rest of (2,747,020 Afghani) remained still unpaid due to the end of the 2004 fiscal year.

In 2005, for the same purpose, a sum of up to (\$80,000) (3,880,000 Afghani) had been granted by the New York City Bank from which after being deposited in the government's imports' account through the (B.23-1598), dated 2004, ..., ... from which a sum of up to 764,712 Afghani through F. 16 (675) dated 2005...,... via Mawlana Rumi construction company and a sum of up to 067,232 afghani through F.16 (852) dated 2005, ...,... via the same company (MawlanaJalaluddin Rumi Construction Company) with total cash paid of 1,831,944 Afghani and the rest of (\$40,000) (2,048,056 Afghani) still remained unpaid due to ending of 2005 fiscal year.

In conclusion, since 2004 and 2005 a total of 4,795,076 Afghani remains unpaid by the Ministry of Finance. The Ministry of Culture and Youth hopes to receive these funds to be used in purchasing the final fittings including floors, furniture etc for the press club, the construction work of which had been completed earlier.
